

"The Role of the Sheriff"

Why it is an office and not a department

Anoka County Sheriff James Stuart regularly gives presentations before local community groups in the county on various issues connected to law enforcement activities. On Tuesday, April 21st, Sheriff Stuart gave a presentation on "The Role of the Sheriff" at The Refuge Golf Course in Oak Grove. The presentation provided an overview of the role, history, and priorities of the office.

In Sheriff Stuart's introduction, he noted that he is the 17th Sheriff of Anoka County, a former marine, and a graduate of St. Mary's University. He stated that he worked his way up the ranks, starting as a patrol deputy in 1994 and served as Captain prior to running for and being elected to the position of Sheriff.

At the beginning of his presentation, Sheriff Stuart stressed two points. He first stated, "Because I am an elected official, I strongly believe in transparency." Transparency being a word used in government to mean open to the public in all aspects of what they do. Second, he clearly explained that he leads a Sheriff's office and not a department, because an office is elected while a department is appointed by someone higher up like a city administrator or city council. He also explained that this is why the elected County Attorney is referred to as an office vs. a department. In Anoka County, both the Sheriff and the County Attorney are directly elected by the people.

Sheriff Stuart stated that his office has six different divisions and is the largest law enforcement organization in the county. He stated that unlike situations that exist in some states, mostly in the south, his office and the police departments within Anoka County get along well and collaborate on many issues.

In Minnesota, Sheriff Stuart stated that he is the chief law enforcement officer in the county, and in all cities, regardless of whether they have a local police department. In some states, the state constitution grants this authority to the sheriff, but in Minnesota, this authority is granted by state law. He made the point to highlight that this means the legislature can change his job description and authority at will. While this system works, it does not provide all the safeguards that exist for sheriffs in states that grant constitutional authority, which can only be modified by a vote of the people. He also noted that only sheriffs, not police chiefs, have certain authority over federal law enforcement officers who operate in the county.

According to Sheriff Stuart, training requirements for the position of Sheriff can vary widely from state to state. In Minnesota, he stated that there are rather stringent

requirements to be qualified to even run for the office. In other states though, you can be elected as the sheriff without having any background in law enforcement or even any previous experience in using a firearm. He noted one sheriff he met at a national training academy chose not to even carry a firearm. In Minnesota, a sheriff is not only the chief administrator of the department, but they are also a fully licensed law enforcement officer.

In his presentation, the six different divisions of the Sheriff's Office were discussed, including Criminal Investigations, Justice Services, and Patrol. Sheriff Stuart stated that Anoka County was unique in that all major crimes in the county go through his office, including areas patrolled by a local city police department. He noted that they are 2nd in the state in catching welfare fraud, and that they run a regional forensic lab for Anoka, Sherburne, and Wright counties. He stated that they receive approximately 30,000 calls for service per year.

Sheriff Stuart also spoke of efforts to reduce training program costs by bringing trainers to the county instead of sending personnel across the state or out of state. He stated that these training opportunities are available to local law enforcement officers in the county and the surrounding area.

Concern was expressed about the age of the jail which was built in 1983. Sheriff Stuart stated that it was at the end of its usable life. He talked about the public misperception that bad criminals go to state prison and minor criminals go to county jail. In reality, he stated the truth is that all people charged with a crime go to a county jail. Then if they are convicted of a serious crime and are given a significant sentence, then they serve this time in a state prison. The Anoka County jail has a capacity of 238, and is generally operating at capacity. In 2014, there were approximately 9500 bookings and an average daily population of 202.

Q & A

Sheriff Stuart backed up the statement he made earlier in the presentation, "You might not like what I have to say, but you will know where I stand", by answering any questions from those in attendance.

Sheriff Stuart was asked about DNA analysis, to which he responded that it typically takes a month to get results, but that there are numerous factors which affect this. He said that DNA analysis has been very successful in vehicle thefts because few criminals wear gloves when committing crimes and leave DNA behind.

On the issue of no knock raids with a search

Sanders Releases Polling Data

Rep. Tim Sanders (R - Blaine, 37B) released the results of his constituent survey last Friday, April 24th. The survey included nine questions.

The majority of those taking the survey were against increasing gasoline taxes and sales taxes to be used for transit. Just under half of the respondents wanted the state surplus refunded to taxpayers. The same percentage of respondents advocate a total repeal of the MNSure health exchange. A majority do not support increasing the per-pupil formula for school funding.

The survey questions and specific results are listed below:

Governor Dayton and the Senate DFL Majority have proposed adding a 6.5% sales tax to fuel at the whole sale level to fund transportation projects. Do you support this proposal?

Yes - 21.32%, No - 75.74%, Undecided - 2.94%

Additionally, Governor Dayton has proposed a half-percent increase in the sales tax in the seven-county metro area to fund transit. Do you support this proposal?

Yes - 23.53%, No - 72.06%, Undecided - 4.41%

The February forecast projected a \$1.9 billion surplus for Minnesota's 2016-17 budget. What should the legislature do with this surplus?

Increase spending	21.37%
Return it to taxpayers	47.33%
Keep it in the reserves	16.79%
Combination of the above	33.59%

Currently, in tight budgeting times school districts make layoff decisions based on teacher seniority. Some legislators are advocating for a reform that allows schools to also consider teacher effectiveness in those decisions. Do you support making this change?

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Under state law, Sunday liquor sales are illegal in Minnesota. Do you support repealing this law, allowing liquor stores to sell alcohol on Sundays?

Republicans and Democrats have introduced separate plans to fund our roads and bridges. Governor Dayton and some DFL legislators support raising the gas tax and increasing the metro-area sales tax, costing the average metro area driver \$25 more per month. The plan would raise at least \$9 billion over the next ten years in new revenue for transportation and transit.

House Republicans introduced an initial plan which will not raise taxes, but fund roads and bridges by an additional \$750 million over the next four years. It includes finding cost savings with MNDOT, dedicating \$200 million of the surplus to fix roads and bridges, and spending 90 percent of the unreserved portion of the Trunk Highway Fund.

warrant, Sheriff Stuart stated that the only time you will see this is if threats are made against law enforcement and they know that weapons are involved. He stated that in order to assure that they have the right house and no mistakes are made, they do multiple verifications of the information they receive

and don't rely solely on informants. Unless they believe that evidence is being destroyed or someone is being hurt, they would prefer to watch and wait for people to leave on their own because it is much safer.

Sheriff Stuart was asked about the sheriff's office owning military vehicles. In response, he stated that he recognized that militarization of police departments is a hot topic. He said that they have one armored vehicle and that it is a phenomenal tool to protect the public. He said that he has witnessed them used appropriately, and also inappropriately, noting again the problems he has seen in southern states.

Sheriff Stuart stated that he was a "huge fan" of conceal carry laws. He said that when he was elected, he did a study of the cost of issuing permits and lowered fees as a result. He also stated that they have a limited number of permit classes which they started based upon feedback from the public.

Sheriff Stuart was then asked about drones and the stingray cellular phone tracking devices. He said they have neither and that they currently do not use them. He did state that he intended to buy a drone in the future, but quickly followed up by stating that it would only be used for emergency purposes. He stated that in situations where they were doing search and rescue, use of a drone could speed up the process. He also gave the scenario of pursuing a suspect who is hiding in an open field, and how it would be safer to use a drone to get an aerial view vs. sending in deputies to find a suspect in a hide and seek situation. On the issue of the stingray cellular phone tracking device, he stated that he believes that Hennepin County is the only agency in the multi-state region to have one and that he sees no need for it in Anoka County.

Sheriff Stuart was asked about his position on deputies wearing body

cameras. In response he stated that he was in favor of them and law enforcement as a whole supports their use. One reason is that it clears them of complaints 98% of the time. He stated the debate was over whether the information should be public and he believes that certain material like bathroom or medical scenes should not be public where it could easily end up on YouTube.

In response to a question about firearm suppressors, Sheriff Stuart stated that he had no strong opinion on the issue and can see both sides.

On the issue of medical marijuana, Sheriff Stuart stated that it is a huge mistake to approve this. He said that there were a lot more effective medications for children. He stated that since it's approve in Colorado, car crashes, medical calls, addiction, and social service costs have all gone up.

In response to a question as to who he was accountable to, Sheriff Stuart stated that he is directly accountable to the people, and the elected county board sets his budget. He further stated that most Minnesota sheriffs stay away from politics. He said, "I am non-partisan and I know I have lost some votes over that, but people know what my views are on issues."

Sheriff Stuart was asked about his position on civil forfeiture, recent problems related to improper seizure of private assets, and how it has affected Anoka County. In response, he stated that it hasn't affected this county much. He stated that he hates to see good quality weapons destroyed as a result of a seizure, but he would never want a situation where the sheriff's office were to auction them off and the buyer then ends up using them for a criminal purpose.

On the issue of civilian oversight of police misconduct, Sheriff Stuart stated that he was not opposed to the concept, but what he has seen at times is the appointment of people to these commissions who dislike law enforcement. He stated that if a commission was created, members should be required to go through all the training that a deputy goes through to see what the job entails. He stated that while he has no tolerance for bad cops, there needs to be a careful balance.

Sheriff Stuart talked about the current atmosphere where it seems that vilifying law enforcement officials have become the rule. He questioned how this would affect the future? He asked who would want the job in this kind of environment. He stated that the value of the job is for those who believe in public service, because the job is not high paying for the work that is required.

Sheriff Stuart touched upon the theme of public service several times throughout his presentation. He commented on his belief that everyone is given an opportunity to make a difference in society and that what matters is what you do with this opportunity. He talked about the motto of God and country, family, and service above self. He also spoke about a commitment to community, youth, and his oath of office. He stressed his focus on youth programs, stating that his personal experience as a youth with law enforcement is what encouraged him to go into this line of work. He focused on the Office's Mission Statement: Protect & serve the community in a manner that preserves the public trust.— *ACR staff*
