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## Mayor's Town Hall Meeting Upsets 3

Nowthen's Reighard, Scheffler, Bettinger Did Not Receive Personal Invites after Missing Key Legislator Meeting

After adjournment of the June 9th Nowthen City Council “workshop” meeting, city councilor Paul Reighard quizzed Mayor Jeff Pilon about the ‘Mayor’s Town Hall’ meeting held at Nowthen Alliance Church on May 31st.

The open-forum public meeting was organized by Pilon for residents to discuss their internet service. The mayor provided information he had gathered in recent meetings with other local and state officials. This included information from a quarterly meeting of county and city officials held in March, and also from a legislator Town Hall meeting held in April. At the April meeting, held at Nowthen Alliance Church, residents asked questions of Sen. Michelle Benson and Speaker of the House Rep. Kurt Daudt. When the topic of broadband came up, Mayor Pilon told the audience there would be a public meeting about it soon.

Mayor Pilon and Councilor Mary Rainville attended the public meeting with legislators. Councilors Reighard, Jim Scheffler and Randy Bettinger were absent.

After Anoka County installed high-speed fiber connections to its buildings, it was expected that private companies would want to run the fiber further to homes and businesses. However, there have been no takers to service the private sector by tapping off these main trunk lines.

Many residents came to the May 31 “Town Hall” meeting to say they had either meager or no internet service at all. The meeting brought concerned residents together to form a committee to begin mapping the city. Data that shows which areas have the best and worst internet service will be collected. (The next committee meeting, open to the public, will be July 25 at 7:00 p.m. at Nowthen Alliance Church).

Reighard wanted to know “how” the *Record* was informed of this and “how (the meeting) all transpired . . . I didn’t know the mayor could hold meetings by himself.”

Mayor Pilon said, “anyone can hold a meeting.”

Reighard asserted that the language in the *Record’s* announcement (see issue of May 24, 2016), using the phrase “Town Hall Meeting” implied a

## Sometimes Silence and Invisibility is the Best Campaign Strategy

On Key Issues, Commissioner Candidate Schilling Shows Lack of Understanding

An avid reader pointed me towards candidate Maris Schilling’s Facebook page and asked me to review some of the statements he has made. Schilling is running against incumbent Anoka County Commissioner Julie Braastad. This commissioner district includes all or part of Andover, Bethel, Blaine, East Bethel, Ham Lake, and Oak Grove.

On Schilling’s Facebook page, he calls Braastad a “career politician”. He also claims that “transparency” was damaged when the county changed the legal newspaper from the *Union-Herald* to the *Record*. He further states that commissioners should maintain a positive working relationship with MICA, the previous relationship having been eliminated by “improper management”.

Schilling then claims that the county lost \$2.8 million a year for roads and bridges because they choose not to implement a per vehicle user tax. He states that without this tax, the only way county roads can be maintained is through property taxes. He supports the per vehicle user tax instead of a “tax on homeowners”.

### The Facts

Braastad fits no reasonable person’s definition of what a “career politician” is. She is finishing up her first term as County Commissioner. Maybe when she is finishing up her third or fourth term, in the mid 2020’s, we can start calling her service a “career.” Sorry, but Braastad’s service on the Ham Lake City Council at about \$1 an hour in pay does not count.

On the newspaper issue, Schilling calls for “transparency” which is government speak for openness in government. The fact is that the county awards this contract and many others through sealed competitive bid processes. This is the most “transparent” option available and is widely used to eliminate corruption and graft on the part of elected officials. The alternative is to violate Minnesota law by awarding contracts to higher bidders that soak the taxpayers for more. In addition, commissioners stated as recent as January 2016 that it makes no sense for taxpayers to pay more

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## State General Fund spending increased \$182 million on July 1st Environment, Public Safety, Economic Development

State spending will increase by about \$182 million over the 2016-2017 biennium, using about a fifth of the \$900 million surplus that was forecast in February.

Sponsored by Rep. Jim Knoblach (R-St. Cloud) and Sen. Richard Cohen (DFL-St. Paul), a new law appropriates an additional \$182.39 million from the General Fund for the current biennium and anticipates an additional \$233.33 million in 2018-19 biennial spending. Articles in the law cover E-12 education, higher education, health and human services, agriculture and environment, jobs and equity, public safety and state government.

The new law takes effect July 1, 2016, unless otherwise noted.

### Environment and Natural Resources (Article 3)

This article appropriates a total of \$2.62 million to the Pollution Control Agency and \$16.7 million to natural resources, including game and fish, over the biennium.

Specific appropriations include:

- \$3.5 million for forest management;
- \$6.459 million for parks and trails management; and

- \$4.4 million for legal costs related to the NorthMet mining project.

Some of the policy changes in this article will:

- allow tribal band members with an identification card to harvest wild rice without a DNR permit;
- require carbon monoxide detectors on new motorboats that have an enclosed compartment;
- allow an expedited land exchange process in exchanging school trust lands and university lands;
- allow nonresidents who are active members of the state’s National Guard to obtain certain residence fish and game licenses;
- require the DNR to develop criteria for certifying entities to conduct a prescribed burn without a permit; and
- create an Aggregate Resources Task Force to study and provide recommendations on issues surrounding aggregates.

### Economic Development, Housing and Energy (Articles 5-7)

The supplemental budget includes an additional \$40 million

in General Fund spending in Fiscal Year 2017 and ongoing reductions for Minnesota job creation fund (\$11.5 million) and the Minnesota investment fund (\$9 million). An additional \$6.08 million is available from a worker's compensation system reform cancellation from Fiscal Year 2016 funding.

Of the new money, \$35 million is to go toward broadband development grants. Of this, only \$5 million may be used for grants to underserved areas, and up to \$1 million may be used for administrative costs.

The law will also change the state access and high-speed goals to that:

- no later than 2022, all Minnesota businesses and homes have access to high-speed broadband that provides minimum download speeds of at least 25 megabits per second and minimum upload speeds of at least three megabits per second; and
- no later than 2026, all Minnesota businesses and homes have access to at least one provider of broadband with download speeds of at least 100 megabits per second and upload speeds of at least 20 megabits per second.

Other General Fund appropriations include:

- \$10 million for the Minnesota 21st Century Fund, which is used to make loans or equity investments in mineral, steel or any other industry processing production, manufacturing or technology project within a specific taconite relief tax area that will enhance economic diversification;
- \$4.5 million for the state's Snowbait program that offers rebates up to 25 percent of expenditures for filmmakers and production companies who spend more than \$1 million in the state if they can prove that it generated economic activity;
- \$3.65 million in a onetime appropriation for Mille Lacs County to develop an area economic relief program;
- \$1.22 million for the Duluth North Shore Sanitary District to reduce debt and bring its monthly wastewater rates in line with similarly situated facilities across the state;
- \$773,000 for Explore Minnesota Tourism to establish a pilot program "to assist in funding and securing major events benefitting communities throughout the state";
- \$750,000 for the state's Workforce

and Affordable Home Ownership Development Program;

- \$500,000 to establish a grant program for the exploited families rental assistance program; and
- \$100,000 for "an easy-to-understand manual to instruct aspiring business owners in how to start a child care business."

Appropriations from the additional \$4.45 million in Fiscal Year 2017 spending from the Workforce Development Fund include:

- \$1 million for rate increases to providers of extended employment services for persons with severe disabilities;
- \$800,000 for day training and habilitation providers to provide innovative employment options and to advance community integration for persons with disabilities as required under the Minnesota Olmstead Plan;
- \$500,000 for rural career counseling coordinators;
- \$500,000 for the Occupational Development Corporation in Buhl to train and provide employment opportunities for people with disabilities and disadvantaged workers;
- \$500,000 for the North East Higher Education District to purchase equipment for training programs due to increased demand under the state's dislocated worker program; and
- \$400,000 is for grants to small business development centers.

Policy provisions in the law include:

- establish an emerging entrepreneur program "to award grants to nonprofit corporations to fund loans to businesses owned by minority or low-income persons, women, veterans, or people with disabilities";
- create a workforce and affordable home ownership development program to "increase the supply of workforce and affordable, owner-occupied multifamily or single-family housing throughout Minnesota"; and
- establish a grant pilot program to serve individuals or families from emerging communities at risk of being homeless and who have been victims of gender-based violence, including but not limited to domestic violence, sexual assault, trafficking, international abusive marriage, or forced marriage.

government meeting. (Neither Reighard or anyone on the city council has asked the *Record's* publisher for clarification on the language used in the announcement).

The council majority members expressed their gall that of all news sources, it had to be the *Record* that informed them of this public forum. (An effort to ban the distribution of the newspaper to city officials occurred last year; see Dec. 11, 2015 edition).

Councilor Scheffler said he was embarrassed when someone asked him if he was going to attend the "Town Hall Meeting" and had to reply he didn't know about it. "How would that make you feel?" he asked.

Reighard declared the council should be notified "as a courtesy" of any future meetings organized by the mayor.

Reighard repeated his statements again the following Tuesday (June 14) during the council's regular meeting. - ACR

for a newspaper that reaches 3% of the population versus 1% of the population.

Schilling clearly demonstrates he has no idea what MICA (Minnesota Inter-County Association) is. MICA is a group of lobbyists that hangs out at the capitol asking for stuff on behalf of a handful of counties. Counties pay MICA membership dues with taxpayer dollars. MICA works *for*, not *with* county commissioners. He also erroneously labels the County's decision to no longer pay MICA as "improper management". MICA is about politics, not about management of the county. Anoka County already has lobbyists on the payroll, the state capitol is a 30 minute drive away, and elected county commissioners are by far the most effective lobbyists at the capitol. MICA was no longer needed.

Schilling's statement about roads shows he doesn't know how the system is funded. Property tax is not the only source of funding. The county receives state bonding, gas tax, federal, private, and other funds, in addition to property tax. The county never "lost" any funding for roads and bridges. They weighted various taxation options and chose not to levy a \$2.8 million tax, collected on vehicles. By keeping road funding on the property tax and away from this per vehicle user tax, you actually help out lower income and high property value residents in the district by making it easier for them to qualify for the state property tax refund program.

### My Call to Schilling

I called Schilling at the phone number provided on his page and introduced myself and my newspaper. I first asked him about his position on MICA. In response, he stated that he does not do phone interviews. I was rather taken aback by this. I have never encountered a candidate who refuses phone interviews.

Then he asks me if I am from the *Union*. I told him no, I am from the *Anoka County Record*. He responds, "oh... oh... your with them."

He then states, "I have never seen your publication." For years, the *Record* has been available at Ham Lake and East Bethel City Halls, both in the district he wishes to represent. I specifically asked him if he has ever set foot in Ham Lake City Hall. He did not respond.

After a pause, he stated, "You don't mail them out." I responded, yes we do if you have a subscription, but we also place free copies at Ham Lake City Hall, East Bethel City Hall, the Courthouse, etc. It is also available at every Anoka County Library. We also post every issue online. His only response was that maybe he would pick up a copy.

He ended the interview by saying he could not talk any further.

### Conclusion

As a candidate for County Commissioner, Schilling has little to no understanding of the issues that he himself has raised. It is doubtful that he has any understanding of the role and responsibility the position entails. It appears that he has never set foot in any of the city halls in communities he wishes to represent.

After speaking with Schilling, I left a message with Commissioner Braastad for a return call. One hour later she called back and was willing to answer any question I had, without any hesitancy about speaking over the phone.

As the means for most Americans to achieve upward mobility, access to a post-secondary education is important.

Of course, having government give out free college is dumb public policy and, of course, is the worst possible remedy.

To start, the reason that college is so expensive is because government has enabled colleges and universities to jack up costs by masking those costs through subsidies in the name of loans and grants.

The game is an easy one to follow. Colleges and universities jack up tuition by a dollar. Government follows suit by increasing grants and loans by a buck.

Pretty soon, the tuition is going up by thousands, followed by increasing grants and loans to match.

In other words, consumers, at least in the short run, are insulated from the negative impacts of price increases.

In a free market system, price acts as a signal.

Increasing prices discourage consumption.

But when price increases are met with a higher subsidy, the cost to the consumer is masked, encouraging the consumer to operate in a distorted market.

When that \$100,000 car looks like a \$30,000 car in the sale manager's office, it's an easier buy.

When that \$500,000 home is financed with a negative amortization or jumbo loan, it look easier to afford.

How ironic that Democrats decry one form of this chicanery but fully embrace the other.

If consumers were exposed to the full downside pressure of increasing college costs, those costs would be held in check and even fall as demand for college fell.

Now, Hillary Clinton is proposing, at least in some form, to completely untether college from the supply-demand equilibrium.

Decoupling any product or service from a market-driven price ultimately proves disastrous.

This is because while price acts as a signal, it also acts as an enforcement mechanism to visit discipline on the market.

If college is "free," what is to stop the supplier from raising prices well beyond what is rationally justified?

If college is "free," what is to stop the consumer of this product from wasting it?

Junior has no business going to college because he's a horrible student and he's lazy, but it's "free" so what's to lose? Get him out of the house and let Faber College babysit him, goes the thinking of thousands of parents if this becomes law.

And if thousands more are attending college, that means that there should be more professors and more buildings, and more support infrastructure for colleges.

The pricing signal in a capitalist economy helps ensure allocative efficiency, meaning that resources are dedicated to their highest and best use.

When capital is allocated to a college or university, it means that capital isn't being allocated elsewhere.

Think about human capital and how this proposal would distort the market.

Under normal circumstances, Johnny would become a carpenter and learn his trade through his private employer.

Now Johnny is at Springfield University, getting some "free" college paid for by the taxpayers.

Johnny would have been better served as a carpenter, but market distortion steered him away.

The same goes for Susie, who would have enlisted in the Air Force and spent a career there.

So college is free? Free to whom? Not to the employers who rely on a workforce that doesn't require a college education.

And no, those careers aren't lesser careers. A career in the construction trades or the military, for example, can be rewarding and provide good pay and benefits for a lifetime.

On the other hand, a college degree is no guarantee of prestige or financial security.

It's not free to the taxpayers, who would be on the hook for yet another government program, the costs of which are heaped on to the \$18 trillion pile of debt our feckless national government has racked up.

This shameless pandering is also another step on the road to socialism, as government would

 AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE RESIDENCY OF CERTAIN PREDATORY OFFENDERS THEREBY AMENDING REVISED CITY CODE -1982 BY ADDING CHAPTER 8-1700, PREDATORY OFFENDERS RESIDENCY

The City of Coon Rapids does ordain:

Section 1. Revised City Code - 1982 is hereby amended by adding Chapter 8-1700, Predatory Offenders Residency as follows:

1 CITY OF COON RAPIDS. MINNESOTA CHAPTER 8-1700 PREDATORY OFFENDERS RESIDENCY

8-1701 Purpose: Repeat predatory offenders who use physical violence. and predatory offenders who prey on children are predators who present an extreme threat to the public safety. Predatory offenders are very likely to use physical violence and to repeat their offenses. Most predatory offenders commit many offenses. have many more victims than are ever reported. and are prosecuted for only a fraction of their crimes. This makes the cost of predatory offender victimization to society at large. while incalculable. exorbitant. It is the intent of this Chapter to serve the City's compelling interest to promote. protect and improve the health. safety and welfare of the citizens of the Coon Rapids by creating areas around locations where children regularly congregate in concentrated numbers wherein certain predatory offenders are prohibited from establishing Temporary or Permanent Residence.

8-1702 Definitions. Words used in this Chapter shall have the following meanings unless otherwise defined in this Chapter.

(1) "Designated Predatory Offender" means any person that has been categorized as a level III sex offender under Minnesota statute 244.052 or successor statute or who has been categorized as a level II sex offender under Minnesota Statute 244.052 in which the victim of the offense was less than 16 years of age. or a similar statute from another states in which that persons risk assessment indicates a high level of re-offense.

(2) "Licensed Daycare" means a group child care facility currently licensed by Anoka County.

(3) "Permanent Residence" means a place where the person abides. lodges. or resides for 14 or more consecutive days.

(4) "Public Playground" means a City or Anoka County owned area designed. equipped and set aside for children's play and includes in that area such facilities as play equipment, surfacing, fencing. signs. internal pathways. internal land forms. vegetation and related structures.

(5) "School" means a public or nonpublic elementary or secondary school.

(6) "Temporary Residence" means a place where the person abides. lodges. or resides for a period of 14 or more days in the aggregate during any calendar year and which is not the person's permanent address. or a place where the person routinely abides. lodges. or resides for a period of four or more consecutive or nonconsecutive days in any month and which is not the person's permanent residence.

8-1703 Prohibited Location of Residence. It is unlawful for any Designated Predatory Offender to establish a Permanent Residence or Temporary Residence:

(1) Within 2.000 feet of any School. Licensed Daycare. or Public Playground.

(2) Within 2.000 feet of the Permanent Residence of another Designated Predatory Offender.

8-1704 Measurement of Distance.

(1) For purposes of determining the minimum distance separation. the requirement shall be measured by following a straight line from the outer property line of the Permanent Residence or Temporary Residence to the nearest outer property line of a School. Daycare Center. Public Playground.

(2) The city clerk shall maintain an official map showing prohibited locations as defined by this chapter. The clerk shall update the map at least annually to reflect any changes in the location of prohibited zones.

8-1705 Exceptions. A Designated Predatory Offender residing within a prohibited area as described in 8-1703 of this Chapter does not commit a violation of this Chapter if any of the following applies:

(1) The person established the Permanent Residence or Temporary Residence and reported and registered the residence pursuant to Minnesota statutes sections 243.166. 243.167. or successor statute. prior to July 23.2016.

(2) The person was a minor when he/she committed the offense and was not convicted as an adult.

(3) The person is a minor.

(4) The School or Daycare Center within 2.000 of the person's Permanent Residence
