

Candidates Set for November Election

Circle Pines and Lino Lakes mayors unopposed
Fridley School Board race already decided

Several school district referendums will be on the ballot for the general election November 7. Undoubtedly this is where the political buzz will be aimed when the returns come in that night. School districts are making some of the largest asks in recent memory.

The Anoka-Hennepin ISD 11 school district will ask voters for \$249 million in the form of General Obligation bonds and an increase in its operating levy by \$226 per pupil unit for ten years, amounting to about \$9.5 million each year. The district expects approximately 37,300 students will be enrolled this fall and there were approximately 2,000 open-enrollment students in the past school year. Informational meetings for voters will be held Sept. 14 at Coon Rapids High School, Sept. 19 at Blaine High School, Sept. 20 at Andover High School, Sept. 21 at Champlin Park High School and Sept. 26 at Anoka High School. All meetings commence at 6:30 p.m.

The St. Francis ISD 15 school district will be making another attempt to ask for \$80 million, reduced from the \$92 million question that was soundly defeated in a special election held May 23. A \$15.5 million question was also defeated in that same election. (The *Record's* coverage of this election can be found in our editions of May 9, May 16, June 6, and July 4). The election will again be consolidated to three polling places and Anoka County Elections will administer for a sum of \$6,000 plus expenses (postage, printing of ballots, etc.).

The Columbia Heights ISD 13 school district has a \$16 million referendum which will be on the Nov. 7 ballot. The money would be spent on improvements to the high school and North Park Elementary.

The White Bear Lake ISD 624 school district will ask voters to extend the current levy another ten years, in the amount of \$1,538 per pupil. (The figure for the coming school year is \$1,507, and the school district has about 9,000 students). About 1,000 voters in Lino Lakes are in the 624 school district.

The St. Francis and Columbia Heights school questions will be the only item on the ballot as there are no city or school board elections in the odd year. The White Bear Lake school district has six candidates vying for four seats. If nine or more candidates had filed, there would have been a primary election. Candidates are Deborah Beloyed,

Secretary of State Voter List Shenanigans Continue

Last week: ACR given same list Simon refuses to give to Trump Committee

When will the partisan political shenanigans end in Minnesota's Office of the Secretary of State? Based upon what I witnessed last week, "not anytime soon" would be the most appropriate answer.

Earlier this year, Secretary of State Steve Simon made several misleading and/or outright false statements about publicly available voter registration information. His grandstanding was done to appease his political supporters, not for purposes of openness in government. In the process, he needlessly frightened Minnesotans and even fooled some politicians in Minneapolis. I detailed the facts of the case in columns that ran on July 4th and 11th.

Now forward to just this past week, Mr. Simon announced that he was "formally" rejecting an information request from President Trump's Advisory Commission on Election Integrity. The request was for public voter registration information.

The same week, but without the press release splash, the *Record* received the same information in the mail from Mr. Simon's office. We received the entire statewide database on a flashy gold CD for only \$51 with a wait time of roughly one week.

Minnesota Statutes 201.091, subdivision 5 states that I can use the information for purposes related to election or political activities. So if I am interpreting the law correctly, the Presidential Advisory Commission on Election Integrity can ask me for this voter registration information. I believe can freely give it to them because doing so would be related to election activities.

If any reader personally knows the chair or vice chair of the commission, Vice President Mike Pence or Kansas Secretary of State Kris Kobach, feel free to pass along my contact info.

Mr. Simon, your 15 minutes of fame on this issue has long passed. Stop serving yourself and start serving the people.

Met Council Governance is Not a Partisan Issue

As local elected officials, we appreciate public debate focused on a proposal to reform the governance model of the Metropolitan Council. However, we disagree with those who suggest it's a partisan attack.

The Council does good works for the region. However, it's not under attack by the GOP, but rather by an inability to evolve into a 21st Century regional authority that better reflects the communities and citizens it serves. The debate is not whether to change a 50-year old model, it's how to change the council to answer modern needs.

As a body made up entirely of appointments by one person, our Met Council represents the interests primarily of that

Governor, much like a state agency. This year that Governor is Mark Dayton. However, in January of 2019 the Council's membership will change with appointments by a newly elected governor. Maybe a Republican, maybe a DFLer or maybe an independent.

As pointed out in a report by the National Association of Regional Councils for Regional

Economic Partners in the MSP Metropolitan Area, a limitation for the Met Council is its political nature. With its leadership politically appointed, there are challenges to ensure long-term consistency of policy directives and priorities.

Jessica Ellison, Jill Engwer, Angela Thompson and incumbents Don Mullin and Kim Chapman. Two seats are open, as George Kimball and Janet Newberg did not file for re-election.

Fridley and Anoka-Hennepin school board seats to be elected Their “official” newspaper makes embarrassing mistake

The Fridley ISD 14 school board race has already been decided but the *Sun Focus*, the legal newspaper of the school district, published in its Aug. 25 edition that Joseph A. Sturdevant, Jr. was a candidate for school board.

He filed, but later withdrew, leaving three candidates on the ballot for three seats. Sturdevant resigned from the school board a year ago, and Carol Thornton was appointed to serve out the remainder of his term. Thornton and incumbent Mary Kay Delvo, along with newcomer Avonna Starck will be on the ballot. Starck is on the city’s Charter Commission.

Three seats on the Anoka-Hennepin ISD 11 school board are up for election. District 6 incumbent Jeff Simon is unopposed, and District 4’s William Fields did not file for re-election. Competing for the open seat are Brian Herda and Anna Dirkswager, both of Andover. Michelle O. Boles of Andover also filed, but later withdrew.

District 2 incumbent Bill Harvey has Jessica Geisler of Coon Rapids as an opponent.

For a number of recent elections, the Spring Lake Park (ISD 16) school board races have been sleepy affairs, but this time seven candidates are running for four seats. Steve Aalund, Michael Kreun, Daphne Ponds and Amy Wheaton are the new candidates, with three incumbents also in the race: John Stroebel, Marilyn Forsberg and Kelly Delfs. Jodi Ruch did not file for re-election. Aalund, Delfs and Forsberg live in Spring Lake Park; the others in Blaine.

The St. Francis, Columbia Heights, Forest Lake and Centennial school districts have their school board elections in the even year.

City candidates file

Only two cities in Anoka County still hold city council elections in the odd year. Mayors Dave Bartholomay of Circle Pines and Jeff Reinert of Lino Lakes are running again unopposed for 2-year terms. Bartholomay served a term as a city councilor, elected in 2001 then ran for mayor in 2005. He’s held the job ever since. This election will be his seventh for mayor. He has only had a challenger in three of these elections. Reinert had opponents in 2011 and 2015 but not in 2013. The voter turnouts in Lino Lakes were 37% in 2011, 13% in 2013 and 31% in 2015. In Circle Pines they were 38% in 2011, 19% in 2013 and 35% in 2015.

Circle Pines city councilors Richard Runbeck and Deb O’Brien are not seeking re-election. Runbeck filed, but withdrew. Three candidates will compete for the two seats to be elected: Dean Goldberg, Jennifer Rauner and Mark Ziemer.

Rob Rafferty and Bill Kusterman have filed for re-election to the Lino Lakes City Council. Dale Stoesz also filed to make a comeback to the council; he was elected in 2011 and served a 4-year council term, but was defeated for re-election in 2015 along with then-incumbent Dave Roeser. Other candidates are Jim Schueller, Ryan Kenny and Brad Robinson making up a field of six candidates for the two seats.

Editor’s Note: In Minnesota, candidates have until 5:00 pm on the last day of filing to submit an affidavit of candidacy. Government buildings accepting these affidavits must stay open until that time. Candidates also have two days following that deadline to remove their name from the ballot.

At times, inexperienced reporters fail to patiently wait for these deadlines to pass before obtaining filing information. Recently, a reporter for the *Duluth News-Tribune* made a gaffe by missing a city council candidate who filed just before the deadline. Nearly a couple weeks had gone by before this was discovered. The article tried to cover the embarrassment by blaming the candidate, claiming he was “playing hard to get” with the reporter.

A number of reforms to Met Council governance have been proposed recently. One respected civic group has proposed staggering the terms of Council members to provide more continuity when administrations change. Another prominent think tank has proposed outright abolition of the Council, citing what it believes to be over-reach of taxing authority. There are also calls to elect members of the met council, so that they are directly accountable to voters.

We support a non-partisan initiative called the Metropolitan Governance Transparency Initiative (MGTI). Proposed by cities and counties, it would align the Met Council with every other regional planning organization in the country. Under the MGTI proposal, the Met Council would be made up of elected officials from metro area cities and counties who are already engaged in their communities and able to bring greater awareness and connections with local and regional issues.

Regional planning authorities, often called Councils of Governments (COG’s), are necessary tools to manage metropolitan growth and efficiency in major cities around the country. Cities like Denver, Seattle and San Francisco have award-winning and admired COG’s coordinating issues of transportation, green space, wastewater treatment, aging services, etc.

The cities mentioned above conform to federal law. Our Met Council does not.

Our proposal takes the best from the COG model and applies the uniquely Minnesotan parts of the Met Council that have largely served us well. It installs a governance model that works well in similar cities, better aligns local governments more closely with our Met Council, is more accountable to the public and better represents local and regional values and interests while benefiting from continuity in leadership. A Met Council comprised – at least in large measure – of local elected officials is that model of governance.

Change is coming. It’s time to have a conversation among local elected officials about what kind of change we want, to best improve the responsiveness and transparency of the Met Council’s work. Minnesota’s current and future Governor must be part of that discussion. So too, should be the local constituents affected by the Met Council’s actions.

In other words, either those laws are good public policy or they are not. Giving one business a pass on them and not others is crony capitalism plain and simple.

The same holds true with the direct subsidies.

Presumably, the subsidies are offered to lessen tax burdens that would otherwise provide too much of a disincentive to invest in Wisconsin.

If this is true, then Governor Walker and the legislature should pass tax cuts that objectively benefit job creators across the board, not just the select few like Foxconn.

Again, the laws are either good public policy or bad. The tax laws either need to be changed or they don't.

The rule of law presupposes that all are treated equally under the law without fear or favor.

Lady Justice wears a blindfold for a reason.

When government starts picking winners and losers, it breeds disrespect and contempt for

our laws and our governing institutions.

We expect liberals to engage in such behavior. In fact, it's the foundation of their governing philosophy.

That Republicans, including House Speaker Paul Ryan, would engage in such blatant job buying is astounding.

In addition to violating core conservative governing principles, the deal is also a clunker from a practical perspective.

According to a non-partisan analysis, the state wouldn't recover its "investment" until 2042.

And that's presuming that Foxconn comes through on both its promise to hire a certain number of workers and pay them the high wages they've promised.

In 2014, Foxconn signed a deal with Indonesia that it would invest at least \$1 billion over 3-5 years. It still hasn't happened.

In 2015, Foxconn signed a memorandum of understanding with India that it would invest \$5 billion and employ at least 50,000 new workers. The project still has not yet identified a construction spot.

Folks, just because Walker is behind it doesn't mean it's a good thing.

Admit it. If Mark Dayton had proposed this corporate welfare, you would be all over him.

STATE OF MINNESOTA CITY OF OAK GROVE TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Notice is hereby given that the Oak Grove City Council will meet at the City Hall, 19900 Nightingale Street NW in the City of Oak Grove, on the 11th day of September 2017, at 7:00 P.M. to consider the proposed assessment for the following road improvement project:

The bituminous surfacing of the following streets within the Blackfoot Forest Subdivision: 194th Lane NW east of Blackfoot Street NW and Woodbine Street NW south of 194th Lane NW all within the City of Oak Grove, Anoka County, Minnesota;

(the "improvement"), and the adoption of a final assessment roll itemizing that portion of the cost of the improvement to be assessed against each property within the area proposed to be assessed.

It is proposed that the cost of the Improvement be assessed against the

properties abutting said listed streets.

The total amount proposed to be assessed against the benefited properties is \$64,870. The proposed assessment roll is on file for public inspection at the City Hall. Written or oral objections will be considered at the meeting. No appeal may be taken as to the amount of an assessment unless a signed, written objection is filed with the City Clerk prior to the hearing or presented to the presiding officer at the hearing.

An owner may appeal an assessment to district court pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 429.081, by serving notice of the appeal upon the Mayor or Clerk of the City within 30 days after the adoption of the assessment and filing such notice with the district court within ten days after service upon the Mayor or Clerk, unless the property owner has failed without reasonable cause to object prior to or at the assessment hearing.

Minnesota law authorizes a city, in making a special assessment, to exercise its discretion to defer the payment of that assessment for any homestead property owned by a person 65 years of age or older or retired by virtue of a permanent and total disability for whom it would be a hardship to make the payments. Any city electing to defer special assessments shall adopt an ordinance or resolution establishing standards and guidelines for determining the existence of a hardship and for determining the existence of a disability, but may determine hardship on the basis of exceptional and unusual circumstances not covered by the standards and guidelines where the determination is made in a non-discriminatory manner and does not give the applicant an unreasonable preference or advantage over other applicants.

The homeowner shall make application for deferred payment of special assessments on forms prescribed by the County Auditor of the county in which the homestead is located. Where the deferred assessment is granted, the Auditor shall record a notice thereof with the County Recorder of said county which shall set forth the amount of the assessment. The taxing authority may determine by ordinance or resolution the amount of interest, if any, on the deferred assessment and this rate shall be recorded by the Auditor along with and in the same manner as the amount of the assessment.
